
As you already know, preparing for your wedding day involves several facets. There are many aspects to consider to ensure that your day is as you imagine it.

During the groom's preparation, I truly enjoy capturing interactions between the groom, his groomsmen and family members. These moments of fraternity, laughter, and emotion will make your wedding day unique.

INDOORS Details +/- 30 mins.

- Lay-flat invitations, vows, rings, etc.
- Boutonniere, cufflinks, etc.
- Suit, shoes, personalized socks.
- Suspenders and belt
- Perfume, watch, glasses, etc.

Dressing up +/- 15-30 mins.

Dressing can be done alone or with parents and friends. Often, the bridal party shares the task. The best man puts on the cufflinks, then a family member helps with the bow tie, and so on. The idea behind this sequence is to give the groom a chance to have a moment with each member of his bridal party.



A Few Poses +/- 30 mins.

- A walk with the bridal party
- A toast spontaneous photos
- Activities jumping, lifting, etc.
- A message to the bride (written note, pranks, etc.)
- Posed and styled portraits with the bridal party
- Solo groom shots



Everyone Outside!

Once everyone is ready, we can go outside for a stroll with the bridal party. This gives the groom a special moment with friends and loved ones to relax and enjoy their company. Whatever ideas you have to make this moment unique, I will be happy to help coordinate it!

Video Team - 30 min to 1 hr

If you have a video team present simultaneously with the photo team, it's important to add at least 30 extra minutes to your schedule for each part of your wedding.

Most of the time, in small spaces such as hotel rooms, photos are taken where the light is best. Therefore, the best photo angles are limited, making it essential to allow enough time for each team to give you their best work.

BRIDE'S PREPARATION & BRIDAL PARTY

Transport & Delays

Plan extra time to get to your destination. Google Maps will give you a relatively accurate estimate if you add in the details of your wedding's itinerary. Keep in mind that with a large group, it will take longer to move your bridal party.





Allow 1 to 2 hours

The bride's preparation is one of the key moments of your wedding day. It's the moment when the anticipation is at its peak and all the excitement is in the air! Here is a list of the most popular photos and activities that you can do.


Details +/- 30 mins.

- Layflat invitations, vows, rings, etc.
- Bouquets: bride and bridesmaids
- Hair accessories and other jewelry
- Kimonos and other personalized accessories
- Wedding dress, shoes
- Veil and dress details

Cheers! +/- 30 mins.

- Preparing champagne glasses
- Photos in kimonos and accessories
- Champagne popping
- Toasting
- Spontaneous moments
- Group hugs and embraces

BRIDE'S PREPARATION & BRIDAL PARTY





Getting dressed +/- 15 mins.

- Mother/family helps dress the bride
- Close-up of the bride's mother's hands
- Mother-daughter moment
- Bride puts on jewelry, shoes, etc.
- Bridesmaids adjust the dress
- Hugs and kisses

Expect some delays 15 to 30 mins.

Delays of all kinds can easily happen on a wedding day. Whether from segments taking longer than planned or traffic on the road, unexpected delays are common. I recommend always leaving extra time between steps to avoid overburdening your schedule. This is even more important if you have multiple locations to visit.











BRIDE'S PREPARATION & BRIDAL PARTY

Once everyone is ready, these shots are worth it! 15 to 45 mins.

Once you and your bridal party are all dressed up, there are many available options to you if time is on your side. Here is a list of ideas that you might want to do:

- Bride solo mini-session
- Reveal to the Father of the Bride
- Reveal to the Mother of the Bride
- Reveal to the Bridesmaids
- Indoor/Outdoor session with close family
- Outdoor session with your children
- Outdoor session with your bridesmaids
- Session with your pet

Helpful Tips

- Prepare a box with your accessories to be photographed so that nothing is forgotten.
- Don't forget to iron your kimonos and the bride's veil!

If you have prepared special gifts for your bridal party, the preparation period is the best time to offer them to your bridesmaids. Photos of this moment aim to be spontaneous to capture your bridesmaids' reactions and let you fully share the moment.



FIRST LOOK 45 mins. to 1 hour

Your wedding day will be filled with emotions, surprises, and moments you will cherish forever. Among these unique moments, the first look stands out as an intimate and privileged moment, where you will see each other for the first time, away from the guests' eyes, in your wedding attire.

WHY HAVE A FRIST LOOK?

- A calm moment before the whirlwind
- Capturing authentic emotions
- Better time management
- A moment just for you
- A gentle introduction to the day

A Few Poses

I will guide you to position you, coordinating every detail to ensure the "first look" goes perfectly. From this moment, I will capture only spontaneous photos, allowing you to live and savor this precious moment fully, without interruptions. Here are a few examples.

- A few seconds before
- Reaction of the groom/bride
- The embrace
- The inspection/walk-around
- Sneaking glances
- The kiss
- Laughter
- Walking together



CEREMONY

Tips & Tricks

Add place markers on the ground so your bridal party knows where to stand. This adds to the symmetry of the photographed image for a more harmonious result.







Ceremony: 45 mins to 1h30

- Processional
- Groom and mother of the groom
- Bridal party
- Page boy and flower girl
- Bride's entrance
- Ceremony, songs, verses, prayers
- Exchange of vows
- Exchange of rings
- Symbolic exchange (bottle, sand, etc.)
- The first kiss
- Bride and groom's exit
- Spontaneous congratulation photos

Group Photo: 10 mins.

The best time to take a group photo is right after the ceremony. We usually discuss with your officiant before the ceremony begins to coordinate and announce to your guests where to go for the photo.







If the ceremony venue is to your liking, I recommend taking family portraits there. Otherwise, coordinate with your wedding planner to make transportation as easy as possible, especially for larger groups.

With your Children - 10 mins.

• If you have small children, start with their mini photo session fist. This will allow us to capture their photos before they are tired and nap time is very much needed.

Family & Bridal Party 20 to 45 mins.

If you have a large family and you would like to have individual photos with each family member, group of friends and bridal party, allow 1 minute per group and/or person. This will give you an idea of the time needed for your family portraits.

- Create a list (which I will have on hand) to make sure no one is forgotten on the day of.
- Have a resource person who knows the members of your family and who will want to be responsible for organizing and rallying the people on your list.
- For the bridal party, I will prepare poses and active moments in advance according to your tastes to create photo opportunities.









Couples Portraits 45 mins. to 1 hour.

I usually ask the couple to reserve 45 minutes for their portrait session. Here, we slow down the pace, and the couple takes a short break to have a bite and spend a moment (almost) alone. This allows me to focus on you, creating a conducive atmosphere for you to relax and enjoy your photo session.

If you have hired a video team, allow extra time for them to also have a privileged moment with you.

- A break / champagne / appetizers
- A variety of posed portraits
- Action and movement poses
- Bride and groom solos
- Heading to the reception



RECEPTION

From 2h30 to 4 hours


Receptions are often a more relaxed time when we take the time to chat with our guests and enjoy their presence.

Here, you no longer pose, and I document the evening by capturing the smiles and all the highlights of your evening with an artistic eye that emphasizes the love in the air, funny moments, and the antics of your guests.

The most common activities are speeches, the bouquet toss, the parents' dance, the first dance, and the cake cutting.

If possible, a short photographic outing during the golden hour is recommended in order to take advantage of the beautiful light at this time of the evening.





RECEPTION

From 2h30 to 4 hours

Here is an example of the chronological order of a typical wedding reception.

- Entrance of the parents and bridal party Golden hour photos
- Entrance of the newlyweds
- Welcome dance
- Toast and welcome speech
- First course and speeches
- Between courses (e.g., shoe game)
- Second course and more speeches
- Between courses (photos with each table)
- Main course

- Parents' and couple's first dance
- Sorbet and/or cake
- Bouquet toss
- Surprise (from groom and/or bride)
- Start of the dancing
- Night photos
- Sweet table
- Midnight snack







GOLDEN HOUR & NIGHT SHOTS

If your schedule allows, a short outing during the golden hour will give you a breathtaking series of photos! The light is at its best and it only takes about ten minutes.

Another alternative is night photography, which is just as beautiful. Again, the mini photo session will only take a few minutes of your time since the technical aspect of this moment will be organized in advance for you.



FINAL NOTE

I hope this example of a detailed photographic schedule for a full wedding day will help you organize the photography segment of your big day!

Remember that each individual segment should be adjusted according to your wishes, and some parts can be omitted according to your preferences. This document is only here to inspire and guide you.

A wedding day is always a whirlwind of emotions, tight schedules and diverse activities, so don't hesitate to embrace the chaos that it can sometimes create! In the end, what really matters is the unforgettable experience you will have. The most important thing is that your day is dazzling, filled with deeply touching moments, and that in the future, you will remember as one of the most magnificent days of your life.

Take the time to have fun, be a little silly, and leave enough time to savor every moment to the fullest.
